**Product Description:** The Avaya G450 Branch Gateway is a multipurpose media gateway that can support up to 450 users when deployed as a Branch Gateway in a mid-to-large branch office of a large enterprise or a call center. This requires Avaya Aura® Communication Manager software running on one or more Avaya servers.

The Avaya G450 Branch Gateway command line interface is accessed via terminal emulation software that resides on the administrator's desktop computer. The conformance statements in this document assume that the terminal emulation software is fully conformant with the statutory requirements of Section 508.

The statements in this document refer only to the text-based command line interface used to administer the Standard Local Survivability (SLS) feature. The SLS feature provides basic telephone services in the event that the connection with the primary External Call Controller (ECC) is lost and there are no survivable servers configured with this branch gateway.

Service personnel and system administrators who require the support of assistive technologies may be unable to perform the initial installation, system setup and upgrades of the Avaya G450 Branch Gateway.
